
# STATISTICAL REPORT JANUARY 1, 2012 thru DECEMBER 31, 2012


### **New Case Filings**

Seventy new cases were docketed by the Bankruptcy Appellate Panel in 2012. Seventeen of those cases (24%) were filed by pro se litigants. Of the cases filed, forty were appeals from contested matters and thirty were appeals from adversary proceedings. The graphics below illustrate the breakdown of case origin by district.


## **District Court Elections**

The chart to the left compares the number of appeals taken to the Bankruptcy Appellate Panel with those taken to the District Courts. In 2012, one hundred thirty appeals were taken from the Bankruptcy Courts. Sixty-seven of those cases (52%) were appealed to and remained with the Bankruptcy Appellate Panel; sixty-three of the cases (48%) were appealed directly to or were transferred to the District Courts.

#### **Case Processing Time**

In 2012, Administrative Panel matters were resolved, on average, in three days. Listed in the table below are average processing times calculated for cases which were briefed, submitted on the merits and subsequently closed in 2012.




#### **Case Dispositions**

Sixty-six cases were closed in 2012. In addition, one case which had previously been closed was re-opened and a new judgment was entered pursuant to a reversal order from the U.S. Court of Appeals. The court wrote a total of thirty-one opinions which disposed of thirty-six cases. To the left is a breakdown of the method by which each case was closed.

### **Opinion Breakdown**

The chart to the right breaks down each opinion by its outcome. As shown in the chart, the majority of opinions (81%) affirmed the Bankruptcy Court decision.



#### **Panel Referrals**

In 2012, twenty referrals were made to Administrative Panels; five of those cases were subsequently referred back to the panels, resulting in a total of twenty-five Administrative Panel referrals. Eighteen cases were submitted on the merits without oral argument and fifteen cases were submitted on the merits after oral argument in 2012. Hearings were held in St. Paul, St. Louis and Kansas City (2). While in Kansas City, the Panel also heard arguments from Fargo and St. Paul using video-conference equipment.

#### Appeals to the U.S. Court of Appeals

A total of twenty-eight bankruptcy appeals were taken to the U.S. Court of Appeals in 2012. Of those appeals, ten were from District Court decisions and eighteen were from Bankruptcy Appellate Panel decisions.

In addition to the eighteen notices of appeal taken from the Bankruptcy Appellate Panel to the Court of Appeals in 2012, eleven cases were pending before the Court of Appeals at the beginning of the year. Seventeen cases were closed by the Court of Appeals during the last year, leaving a total of twelve pending cases. Following is a breakdown of the method by which BAP cases appealed to the Court of Appeals were closed:
