In re Complaint of John Doe¹

John Doe has filed a “Judicial Complaint Pursuant to Chapter 16, Title 28.” The court will treat this filing as a petition or application for a writ of mandamus, assigning the filing to an administrative panel. John Doe’s complaint is “directly related to the merits of a decision or procedural ruling” and is not a proper subject for a judicial complaint. 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii); *see* Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings of the Judicial Conference of the United States, Rule 11(c)(1)(B).

The complaint is dismissed.
