In re Complaint of John Doe¹

These are judicial complaints filed by an incarcerated pro se litigant against a United States district judge assigned to several of the litigant's actions and three United States circuit judges who participated in one of the litigant's appeals.

The judicial complaints allege that the district judge and circuit judges have violated 18 U.S.C. § 912 by impersonating an officer of the United States. The judicial complaint alleges that the district judge and circuit judges do not live on federal territory. According to the complainant, they are not actually Article III judges but instead "Territorial Judges" in accordance with Article IV, § 3, clause 2, of the U.S. Constitution.

These allegations must be dismissed because they are "frivolous." 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii); accord J.C.U.S. Rule 11(c)(1)(C).

The complaint is dismissed.
