## In re Complaint of John Doe<sup>1</sup>

This is a judicial complaint filed by a pro se litigant against three United States circuit judges who presided over the litigant's appeal. In the judicial complaint, the pro se litigant does not describe the conduct or evidence of disability that is the subject of the complaint against the circuit judges. Instead, the pro se litigant attached exhibits to the judicial complaint that do not set forth any allegations against the circuit judges.

The judicial complaint fails to "contain a concise statement that details the specific facts on which the claim of misconduct or disability is based." Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings of the Judicial Conference of the United States (J.C.U.S.) Rule 6(b). Therefore, it "lack[s] sufficient evidence to raise an inference that misconduct has occurred or that a disability exists." 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii); accord J.C.U.S. Rule 11(c)(1)(D).
