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1 **PROCEEDINGS** 2 (March 23, 2018) 3 THE SPECIAL MASTER: Good afternoon, Counsel. 4 is Greg Grimsal in New Orleans. I am here with Alex Rothenberg 5 and we are on the record. Let me start by taking roll. 6 Mr. Somach, are you on the line? 7 I am, Your Honor. With me is Mac MR. SOMACH: 8 Goldsberry, Theresa Barfield, Brittany Johnson, and I believe 9 on a separate line Robert Hoffman. 10 THE SPECIAL MASTER: Thank you, Mr. Somach. Anybody else for the State of Texas? 11 12 Mr. Rael, are you on the line? 13 MR. RAEL: I am, Your Honor. With me is Deputy 14 Attorney General Tania Maestas. 15 THE SPECIAL MASTER: Thank you. 16 Anybody else for the State of New Mexico? 17 Mr. Wallace, are you on the line? 18 MR. WALLACE: Yes, I am. Good afternoon, Your Honor. 19 THE SPECIAL MASTER: Good afternoon, Mr. Wallace. 20 Anybody else for the State of Colorado? 21 MR. WALLACE: Yes. Karen Kwon from our office is 22 also here. 23 THE SPECIAL MASTER: Thank you. 24 Mr. DuBois, are you on the line? 25 MR. DUBOIS: I am, Your Honor. Good afternoon.

THE SPECIAL MASTER: Good afternoon. 1 03.02 2 MR. DUBOIS: Lee Leininger is also on. I believe 3 Judy Coleman is on and Steve Macfarlane. 4 THE SPECIAL MASTER: Thank you. 5 MR. MACFARLANE: Your Honor, this is Stephen 6 Macfarlane. I have Shelly Randel from the Interior solicitor's 7 office on the line with me. 8 THE SPECIAL MASTER: Thanks very much, Mr. Macfarlane. 9 10 Ms. Randel, nice to have you with us. 11 Anyone else for the United States? 12 Okay. Let me go through the amici who have 13 requested to listen in on this. 14 Mr. Brockmann, are you on the line? 15 MR. BROCKMANN: Yes, sir. 16 THE SPECIAL MASTER: Anyone else for your client? 17 MR. BROCKMANN: No, sir. 18 **THE SPECIAL MASTER:** Mr. Caroom, are you on the line? 19 MR. CAROOM: Yes, I am. Susan Maxwell is with me. 20 THE SPECIAL MASTER: Thank you very much. 21 MS. MAXWELL: Good afternoon, Your Honor. 22 THE SPECIAL MASTER: Good afternoon, Ms. Maxwell. 23 Mr. Stein, are you on the line? 24 MR. STEIN: Yes, Special Master. I'm on the line for 25 the City of Las Cruces.

THE SPECIAL MASTER: Anyone else with you? 1 03.03 2 MR. STEIN: No, sir. 3 THE SPECIAL MASTER: Thank you. 4 Ms. Barncastle, you are on the line? 5 MS. BARNCASTLE: Yes. Good afternoon. Your Honor. 6 THE SPECIAL MASTER: Anyone else for Elephant Butte 7 Irrigation District? 8 No, sir, not today. MS. BARNCASTLE: 9 THE SPECIAL MASTER: Thank you. Ms. O'Brien? 10 11 MS. O'BRIEN: Yes, Your Honor. Ms. O'Brien here for 12 El Paso County Water Improvement District No. 1. No one else 13 is on the line for the district today. 14 THE SPECIAL MASTER: Thank you. 15 Mr. Miller? Mr. Miller? We will pass him. Ms. Davidson? 16 17 MS. DAVIDSON: Yes, Your Honor. I'm here and I'm 18 alone. 19 THE SPECIAL MASTER: Thank you. 20 Mr. Utton for New Mexico State University? 21 MR. UTTON: Yes, Special Master. John Utton 22 representing New Mexico State University. I am on the line as 23 well. 24 THE SPECIAL MASTER: Thank you. 25 Is there anyone else on the line?

THE SPECIAL MASTER: Yes, sir.

MR. SOMACH: I could this afternoon just file a

MR. KOPP: Yes, Your Honor. This is Michael Kopp for the State of New Mexico.

THE SPECIAL MASTER: Would you spell your last name.

MR. KOPP: K-O-P-P.

THE SPECIAL MASTER: Thank you.

Anyone else? Last call. Thank you, Counsel.

I believe Grace Triche from our office circulated a service list for your review, comment, and correction. If you haven't had a look at it yet, please do so. Forward any corrections you might have to her.

The business at hand today is to get a couple of dates going forward for some stuff we have to do. First on the list, I would like a date by which Texas' complaint and the United States' complaint in intervention could be filed of record herein. Once that happens, they will be treated as complaints within Supreme Court Rule 17.2 and Federal Rules 8 through 11.

Mr. Somach and Mr. DuBois, can you let me know how quickly you could have those pleadings filed.

I just note that I had filed a stand-alone complaint with a cover letter I sent. It's actually on the website. It's at Docket 55.

MR. SOMACH: Yes. Your Honor, this is Stuart Somach.

stand-alone -- with no cover letter -- copy of that complaint, if you would like me to do so.

THE SPECIAL MASTER: Yes, that would be fine. I think it would be good to have a formal starting point. I think it's a good formality to go through. I appreciate that.

Mr. DuBois.

MR. DUBOIS: I think we can file this afternoon, if you like, Your Honor.

THE SPECIAL MASTER: That's great.

Mr. Rael, how long would New Mexico need to file an answer and any counterclaim it might have to the complaint and the complaint in intervention?

MR. RAEL: Your Honor, the parties met and conferred a little bit about this. Texas, the United States, Colorado, and New Mexico have agreed that the State of New Mexico will have 60 days from today's date upon which to file our answers and any counterclaims. Moving forward, any responses to any counterclaims would be due 60 days from then, if that's okay with Your Honor.

THE SPECIAL MASTER: I'm glad to hear that.

Mr. Wallace, I'm not, obviously, requiring you to file any responsive pleading, but I take it you were a party to those conversations and, if Colorado decided it wanted to file an answer, that those deadlines are acceptable to you?

MR. WALLACE: Your Honor, yes, I had conversations

with the other attorneys just earlier today, actually, on that topic. One, I will start out by saying I don't have any objection to those 60-day timelines. Something that we are looking at is what the impact to Colorado might be for filing or not filing with regard to an unintentional waiver of any rights it might have.

THE SPECIAL MASTER: Right.

MR. WALLACE: The parties are going to continue to try to work out and document how to avoid an unintentional waiver. Then we could submit that to the Court.

THE SPECIAL MASTER: That sounds great.

Well, thank you, Counsel. That's all very helpful and good to hear.

Moving on to the next agenda item, how long would the parties require to meet and confer and prepare for my review a draft case management plan? I believe Mr. Somach had previously indicated that he had a model he was going to share with people. The floor is open. Let me know what your thoughts are on that.

MR. SOMACH: Yes. Your Honor, this is Stuart Somach again. In fact, I did circulate a draft case management plan. We have, again, conferred among us. We are meeting on April 4 to go over that case management plan and hopefully within -- I think the 4th is -- I can't remember what day of the week. It's like a Tuesday or Wednesday. My thought would be if you

can give us a week after that -- I actually think we will be able to reach a resolution that day. If we have an additional week, if there are any outstanding issues that we want to discuss, that will give us time to hop on a telephone conference and do that.

THE SPECIAL MASTER: Mr. Somach, the 4th is a Wednesday. I will be happy to give you to the end of the next week if that would lower everybody's blood pressure.

MR. SOMACH: I think that's fine. I'm not anticipating that we will have any particular issues, but that would work just fine.

THE SPECIAL MASTER: Okay. So if I'm understanding everybody correctly, by April 13 it's everyone's hope and plan to be able to submit to me a draft plan for my review; is that correct?

MR. SOMACH: Correct.

THE SPECIAL MASTER: What I think would make sense would be to go ahead and schedule a phone conference in the event there are matters as to which, heaven forbid, you are not able to agree. I'm thinking perhaps a week after that we can set one. If we don't need it, I can take it off the calendar. I'm thinking on the 20th I will set another phone conference so that it's on everyone's calendar if we need it. Is that fair?

MR. SOMACH: Yes, that's fair for Texas.

MR. RAEL: New Mexico as well.

THE SPECIAL MASTER: Any objections to that?

MR. WALLACE: Your Honor, this is Chad Wallace. I have no objection, but I have a jury summons myself at that time. I'm hoping I would be available the following week.

THE SPECIAL MASTER: The 27th, you mean?

MR. WALLACE: Any time that week, yes. The week of the 23rd to the 27th I would be available.

THE SPECIAL MASTER: How about we do it on the 23rd, then? My intention would be to set it at the same time as this.

By the way, I chose this time because I figured it would make life a little bit easier for the folks out west. If there's a time that you prefer, please let me know. I'm prepared to accommodate you.

Otherwise, let's plan on doing this at 3:00 Central on the 23rd. You will be submitting your hopefully stipulated draft case management plan for my consideration on the 13th.

If there are any issues as to which the parties are not able to agree, may I ask that you submit the pieces you have agreed on and then maybe a letter brief, not more than two pages, addressing the issues as to which there is no agreement. I would ask that those be submitted on the 13th as well. After the 4th you will probably know. I imagine that would give you enough time to put together a letter brief for my

consideration. Does that work? 1 2 MR. SOMACH: It works for Texas, Your Honor. 3 THE SPECIAL MASTER: Any objections? I don't 4 Great. This has been very helpful. 5 think I have anything else. Does anybody else have anything we need to discuss right now? 6 7 MR. DUBOIS: Your Honor, this is Jim DuBois. Should we expect the same conference number as this time? 8 9 THE SPECIAL MASTER: Yes. I apologize for failing to 10 put that in the first case management order. It will be pretty 11 much this number going forward for all future conferences. Ι 12 will try to remember to put it in case management orders. Just 13 rattle my cage if I fail to. It's important that you get correct notification of the numbers we are using. 14 15 Anything else for the good of the order? 16 Counsel, thanks very much. I appreciate the 17 work you did on this. I hope everybody has a good weekend. 18 MR. SOMACH: Thank you, Your Honor. You too. 19 THE SPECIAL MASTER: Thanks, Counsel. We are off the 20 record. (Proceedings adjourned.) 21 22 * * * 23 24
