PER CURIAM.

German Escorcía was found guilty of conspiring to distribute and possess with intent to distribute methamphetamine, in violation of 21 U.S.C. § 846, and the district court¹ sentenced him to 121 months imprisonment and five years supervised release. On appeal, Escorcía's counsel has filed a brief and moved to withdraw pursuant to

Anders v. California, 386 U.S. 738 (1967). Although Escorcía was granted permission to file a pro se supplemental brief, he has not done so.

After review of counsel's Anders brief, along with our independent review of the record in accordance with Penson v. Ohio, 488 U.S. 75 (1988), we conclude that there are no nonfrivolous issues for appeal. Accordingly, we affirm the judgment of the district court, and we grant counsel's motion to withdraw.
