PER CURIAM.

In this civil rights action, Steven Reed appeals the District Court's¹ dismissal of his claims against Choice Hotel International and the Court's grant of summary judgment in favor of the City of Springfield, Missouri.² After careful de novo review, see Schaaf v. Residential Funding Corp., 517 F.3d 544, 549 (8th Cir.), cert. denied, 129 S. Ct. 222 (2008); Anderson v. Larson, 327 F.3d 762, 767 (8th Cir. 2003), we affirm, see 8th Cir. R. 47B. We dismiss all pending motions as moot.
