PER CURIAM.

Cadero King appeals the district court's order affirming the denial of disability insurance benefits and supplemental security income. Upon de novo review, we find

no basis, and King offers none, for reversal. <u>See Nash v. Comm'r Soc. Sec. Admin.</u>, 907 F.3d 1086, 1089 (8th Cir. 2018) (de novo review of district court's judgment; upholding Commissioner's decision if it is supported by substantial evidence on record as whole). The judgment is affirmed. <u>See</u> 8th Cir. R. 47B.<sup>2</sup>
