PER CURIAM.

Khemall Jokhoo, who is proceeding pro se, appeals after the district court¹ revoked his supervised release and sentenced him to 24 months in prison and 24

months of supervised release. Having jurisdiction under 28 U.S.C. § 1291, this court affirms.

Upon careful review of the record and the issues properly presented, this court concludes that there is no basis for reversal. The district court did not impose a substantively unreasonable sentence, *see United States v. Miller*, 557 F.3d 910, 917 (8th Cir. 2009) (substantive reasonableness of revocation sentence is reviewed under deferential abuse-of-discretion standard), and the sentence is below the statutory maximum, *see* 18 U.S.C. § 3583(e)(3). This court rejects Jokhoo's argument that his sentence violates the Eighth Amendment, *see United States v. DeCoster*, 828 F.3d 626, 634-35 (8th Cir. 2016), and concludes his remaining arguments lack merit.

The judgment is affirmed, and Jokhoo's request for appointment of counsel is denied.
